

Paul Watts (1943 - 2019)

Paul will be much missed by his friends in the Mapperley and Sherwood local history group (MASH) which he founded in 2007.

His idea was that the group provided a forum for local members to share their research into aspects of the history of the immediate neighbourhood, its buildings, its people, and its topography. Paul was particularly interested in old maps which he used to write articles on the pre medieval history of the area, and the gardens of Mapperley Park. He also published a pamphlet on the history of

All Saints Church in Raleigh Street where he was vicar in the 1980s. Four hundred people met in the church for his funeral on 7.9.19. MASH still thrives, meeting every few weeks. Paul's enthusiasm and initiative, which he maintained to the end inspired us all, especially as he was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease in 2001. His wife Ruth still lives in Mapperley Park and has been well



supported by her sons and their families who regularly travel back to Nottingham.

Waste Nott. A new Zero Waste Shop for Sherwood

As a response to immense public concern for the environment following TV programmes such as Blue Planet 2 and Countryfile we have decided to establish a unique zero waste shop in Sherwood.

The aim of the shop is to provide food and other items which require no plastic packaging and at the heart of everything is recycling. It's going well.

Many of our customers are now coming armed with their own containers and we have received lots of positive comments. Our product list has grown in response to consumer requests. The thing we lack is more space! We now stock local honey from Woodthorpe and have recently acquired a coffee bean grinder for our Sneinton roasted coffee beans.

The shop has been founded as a Community Interest Company (CIC)

and all profits will go to local charities and good causes. It is, in effect, rather like a community shop in a village owned by the local people. Its founders come from a wide range of backgrounds including, teaching, being a pub landlord, writing for the theatre, computing, nursing, the law, building maintenance and one even has a background in retail!

Items to be sold come under the headings of: Pulses, Grains, Beans, Pasta, Baking, Gluten free, Spices, Dried herbs, Nuts, Seeds Dried fruits, Snacks, Teas and Coffees, Liquid foods (e.g. honey, vinegar, olive oil etc.), Cleaning items, Toiletries, Containers and Personal care.





All products have been ethically sourced.

We hope that people who feel like we do about the environment will consider becoming volunteers with us.




Introducing Isata

Isata Kanneh-Mason who lives with her family in Mapperley Park has achieved so much this year. We can't wait to see what you will achieve in 2020. Below is Isata's impressive biography!

Isata Kanneh-Mason's debut album, Romance, drew popular and critical acclaim, entering the UK classical charts at No. 1 when it was released in July 2019 and leading Gramophone magazine to extol the recording as "one of the most charming and engaging debuts" and Classic FM to praise Isata as "a player of considerable talent". Isata recorded the all-Clara Schumann disc for Decca Classics as an homage to the composer and pianist in the year of what would have been her 200th birthday, selecting works from across her compositional output including solo piano pieces, a sonata, chamber music with violinist Elena Urioste, transcriptions of two of her husband Robert's songs, and the piano concerto, which she recorded with the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra and conductor Holly Mathieson.

Whilst continuing her postgraduate studies with Carole Presland as a Gwendolyn Reiche scholar at London's Royal Academy of Music, Isata Kanneh-Mason has embarked on a successful and increasingly busy concert career

as a solo artist, with concerto appearances, solo recitals and chamber concerts throughout the UK and abroad, including a return to King's Place in solo recital, and a debut with the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra at the Royal Albert Hall. Isata also continues to perform with her siblings, including regular duo recitals with her brother, the cellist, Sheku Kanneh-Mason.

Highlights this season include a tour of Italy, appearances at the Edinburgh

Festival, Wigmore Hall, Amsterdam Concertgebouw, Théâtre des Champs Elysées, Rheingau Festival, and an extensive ten-city North American tour,

including their debut recital at New York's Carnegie Hall and a return to the Vancouver Recital Society.


Isata has also performed in the Portland Piano Series in Oregon, the Barbican Centre's Sound Unbound festival, The Color of Music Festival in South Carolina, at the Edinburgh, Cheltenham, and Bath festivals, the Snape Proms, the Musikfestspiele Saar, and in venues from Antigua and the Cayman Islands, to Perth. Isata reached her category final in the 2014 BBC Young Musician competition, winning the Walter Todds Bursary for the most promising musician. She has since performed several times on television and radio, including on BBC Radio 3 In Tune, the South Bank Sky Arts Awards, The Andrew Marr Show, the Radio 3 RPS Awards, BBC2 Proms Extra, Radio 4 Front Row and Woman's Hour, Al Jazeera TV, BBC World Service, Channel 4, The One Show, ITV

Born To Shine, BBC2 Classroom Heroes, and a feature for CBS Sunday Morning. Isata made her debut as a television presenter for the coverage of the 2019 BBC Proms.

She previously completed her undergraduate degree at the Academy as an Elton John scholar, and performed with Sir Elton in 2013 in Los Angeles. Isata is also grateful for support from the Nottingham Soroptimist Trust, Mr and Mrs John Bryden, Frank White, and Awards for Young Musicians.



Sherwood FC is the youth football team local to Mapperley Park. Many MP residents are either currently playing, have played in the past or have managed or coached teams with the club. Sherwood FC has grown to be one of the biggest, and we hope friendliest, grassroots clubs in Nottingham.

In a pickle looking for a new sport? Try pickleball!

Mapperley Park is surprisingly well provided for those residents looking to pick up a racquet, with both Mapperley Park Tennis Club and Magdala Lawn Tennis Club on our doorsteps if anyone is for tennis.

Less well known than tennis, but fast rising in popularity in the US and Europe, is the game of pickleball. This is a bat and ball game played usually as doubles and is picked up returning tennis players or those looking for a new sport to try.

This August players and a coach from Mapperley Park Tennis Club made it through to the English Open Pickleball Championship, held at the University of Nottingham. They put in a great showing, with all players having a fantastic time and doing well in their matches, losing only in the bronze medal run offs for both the ladies' and mixed doubles, and achieving bronze in the men's doubles! Pickleball is a game played on a badminton-sized court, with a paddle-like bat and a plastic ball. It's a cross between tennis and badminton, with the smaller court meaning less running for the ball but a need for good reactions and pickle tactics.

Pickleball is easy to learn but has its own strategy. Having played any other racket sport is an advantage but is not necessary. All ages can play, at the Open there were several age groups from young adults to over 60s, and some older players too. There are coaching and play sessions every Wednesday at Mapperley Park Tennis Club, off Mapperley Hall Drive. The sessions are from 10am-12pm, and all equipment including bats is provided.

Jhinga Hara Masala King Prawns Serves 4

Marinade

10g Ginger Garlic Paste

1 tsp Lemon Juice

1 tsp Cooking oil

100g Hara Masala Paste

20g Yoghurt

Salt to taste

¹/₂ **tsp** Garam Masala (add more to taste)

2 tbs Coriander Powder

50g Mint Sauce

12 King prawns

5 bunches of Fresh Coriander


2 bunches of Fresh Mint

Cooking Method

- Chop the Fresh Coriander, Fresh Mint and Green

 Then gently stir in the raw prawns. Cover and leave in fridge for 8 to 24 hours.
- 3. Preheat grill to high heat. Place the prawns on a wire rack in a grill pan and heat for approximately 6 minutes, turning over half way through.
- Remove from the heat and serve immediately with vegetables or salad and enjoy!
